



# Accelerating Data Value Across a National Community Health Center Network (ADVANCE) Dissemination Guidelines

### For ADVANCE Partners

Last update: March 2024

The guidelines aim to document a shared understanding and approach for disseminating research findings from ADVANCE-supported projects. The following principles guide ADVANCE in our research dissemination efforts. ADVANCE aims to:

- Integrate EHR-based data from five partners along with various types of externally sourced data such as claims data and federal mortality data.
- Integrate inpatient and outpatient data from two hospital systems (University of Washington and Oregon Health & Science University).
- Expand efforts to engage patients and clinicians on the design, implementation, and interpretation of comparative effectiveness research.
- Develop electronic systems for recruiting study participants and collecting patient-reported data.
- Strengthen the infrastructure of our community academic partnerships to support patient-centered outcomes research (PCOR), and support Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) to become learning health systems.
- Build the capacity of participating FQHC networks to meet research regulatory requirements.

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# **ADVANCE Requirements**

ADVANCE-supported deliverables must include:

- 1. Descriptions of ADVANCE Clinical Research Network (CRN) and ADVANCE data use when applicable, typically in the Methods section (see examples in <u>Additional Resources section</u>)
- 2. Statement of Institutional Review Board (IRB) review and approval, typically in the Methods section
- 3. The ADVANCE acknowledgement (see Acknowledgement Guidelines section)
- 4. The ADVANCE logo in posters and presentations; please contact your project's ADVANCE point of contact for a high-resolution copy.

# **Acknowledgement Guidelines**

Manuscripts, presentations, presentations, and other academic communications deriving from ADVANCE-supported projects should recognize the ADVANCE CRN and the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute® (PCORI) grant using the acknowledgement listed below. This acknowledgement should be included in all academic deliverables deriving from ADVANCE-supported projects regardless of the data used in the deliverable itself.

## Acknowledgement for academic ADVANCE-supported project deliverables

The research reported in this work was powered by PCORnet®. PCORnet has been developed with funding from the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute® (PCORI®) and conducted with the Accelerating Data Value Across a National Community Health Center Network (ADVANCE) Clinical Research Network (CRN). ADVANCE is a Clinical Research Network in PCORnet® led by OCHIN in partnership with Health Choice Network, Fenway Health, University of Washington, and Oregon Health & Science University. ADVANCE's participation in PCORnet® is funded through the PCORI Award RI-OCHIN-01-MC.

For non-academic deliverables with space limits (e.g. blog posts, news articles, reports) that cannot accommodate the full acknowledgement above, the following acknowledgement may be used: "ADVANCE is a Clinical Research Network in PCORnet® which has been developed with funding from the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute® (PCORI®)."

# **Pre-submission Requirements**

In accordance with our PCORI/PCORnet reporting requirements, all ADVANCE-supported projects must follow the review and tracking process below. This applies to all academic deliverables, including manuscripts, posters, and presentations. For deliverables without OCHIN co-authors, a member of your team should follow the process below. For collaborative work co-authored by OCHIN staff, please work with your OCHIN Research Associate (RA) to follow the process below.





#### **Review Process**

The OCHIN dissemination team will review manuscripts, posters, presentations, and other collateral for descriptions of the ADVANCE CRN, resources used, and acknowledgements to ADVANCE, PCORnet®, and PCORI as our funder.

A designated team member should submit a <u>Manuscript, Poster, and Presentation Review Request</u> as outlined below.

- 1. For "review type", select expedited review.
- 2. Provide your contact information.
- 3. Select your deliverable type and enter the required information.
- 4. The designated team member should attach a copy of the deliverable in a draft as near to final as possible. Many teams find it works well to submit deliverables for ADVANCE review at the same time they send for final co-author review.
- 5. When the completed review is received, you may respond to the edits and comments as appropriate and further review is not required.

# **Requirements Upon Acceptance**

#### **Manuscripts**

Upon notification of a manuscript's journal acceptance, the designated study team member should email the following information to the tracking inbox (<a href="mailto:researchtracking@ochin.org">researchtracking@ochin.org</a>), which is managed by the OCHIN dissemination team.

- Submission, acceptance, and online publication dates
- Project(s) associated with the manuscript
- A working link to the manuscript, if available

#### **Posters/Presentations**

Upon notification of a presentation's conference acceptance, the designated study team member should email the following information to the tracking inbox, <a href="mailto:researchtracking@ochin.org">researchtracking@ochin.org</a>.

- Presenter list
- Date of presentation
- Title of the poster/presentation,
- Type of presentation (poster, oral presentation, workshop, panel, etc.)
- Conference name, City, and State
- Projects associated with the poster/presentation

ADVANCE is a multicenter collaborative led by OCHIN in partnership with Fenway Health, Health Choice Network, Oregon Health & Science University, and University of Washington.
- 2. ADVANCE partners serve Federally Qualified Health Centers, public health departments, and community-based health centers delivering care to people who are publicly insured, uninsured, or otherwise medically underserved. ADVANCE integrates outpatient EHR data and geocoded community-level data into a common data model, which is the nation's most comprehensive set of health care and outcomes data for patients using health center services.
- 3. ADVANCE is a multicenter research network led by OCHIN in partnership with Fenway Health, Health Choice Network, Oregon Health & Science University, and University of Washington. As the nation's most comprehensive set of health data from community-based health centers, ADVANCE integrates outpatient health record data and community-level data that represents over 10 million people seen in over 250 community-based health systems across nearly forty states.
